

## FARM INSPECTION CHECKLIST



Your employees are key to the care of your crops! This handy checklist reminds you what to look for in a safety check and will help ensure that you and your employees get home safely at the end of each day. A few minutes spent on a safety check can prevent a lifetime of loss.
