

# The WorkSafeNB Health and Safety Educator Award recognizes educators who demonstrate a commitment to promoting and advancing youth health and safety.

#### A nominee will have demonstrated several or all of the following examples of exceptional leadership:

- Is an employee of a school or Early Learning and Child Care (ELCC) centre in either a K-12 or ELCC-12 environment, and has clearly demonstrated a commitment to creating a safety culture for New Brunswick youth.
- Emphasizes the importance of health and safety through curriculum and acts as a role model for safe and healthy practices at the school/centre and during extracurricular events.
- Promotes health and safety for youth by engaging external safety speakers, such as health and safety or subject-matter experts.
- Partners with WorkSafeNB to develop and promote health and safety initiatives (may use WorkSafeNB's health and safety resources, participate in the CCOHS and WorkSafeNB annual youth video contest, etc.).
- Goes above and beyond to support the overall message of health and safety for New Brunswick youth.

Teams or groups of educators who collaborate on health and safety initiatives are eligible for nomination. If a team/group is recognized for the award, only one cash prize and plaque will be awarded.

WorkSafeNB employees and their immediate family members (parents, siblings, children and/or anyone living in same household) are not eligible for this award.

#### **Nomination**

WorkSafeNB will accept nominations from students, the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, school districts/schools, ELCC centres within schools, peers and parents/parent groups.

#### **Decision**

A committee comprising WorkSafeNB and Department of Education and Early Childhood Development representatives will determine award recipients.

#### **Awards**

- One recipient or group will be chosen from the anglophone sector and one from the francophone sector for a total of two awards.
- Winners will be awarded a plaque and a prize of \$500. An equivalent cash prize of \$500 will be awarded to the recipient's school.
- Award recipients will be recognized at WorkSafeNB's annual Health and Safety Conference, held Oct. 3-5, 2018. In the case of a group, one member will be asked to accept the award at the conference on behalf of the group.
