

## Potato Harvesting – SAFETY ORIENTATION CHECKLIST

Before starting work at this farming operation, employees must review the following safe working procedures.

Note: When completing this checklist, information about the major designated danger areas (such as pinch points, axles, railings, air vacuum, etc.) must be included.

U	perators			
•	Only designated operators are responsible for the safe moving of machinery and crew.			
•	Once stopped, machinery should not be moved until the operator, or a person designated by the operator, has ensured no person is at risk.			
•	Operators or owners shall ensure all machinery is equipped with proper guarding.			
•	All trucks and harvesters shall be equipped with back-up alarms. 🐵			
•	Operators shall park harvesters in a safe area, turn them off and engage safety devices, before any cleaning, maintenance or repair is done.			
•	At lunch or break times, operators should stop harvesters as close to the designated parking area as possible, or bring the crew to that area in a safe manner.			
•	When unloading, trucks should not begin the "backing-in" process until a designated person is in place to assist and direct the driver. All other employees are to remain clear of the operation.			
•	Operators must ensure employees are aware of pinch point hazards.			
•	Owners must notify the Department of Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour — Employment Standards Branch, when workers under the age of 16 are employed.			
V	<i>l</i> orkers			
•	Workers should never walk between harvesters and loading trucks while in movement.			
•	Workers should be aware of pinch points, moving parts or conveyors and keep clear of them at all times.			
•	Workers should wait until equipment comes to a complete stop before embarking or disembarking.			
•	Storage crews should stay beyond the loading end of the bin piler.			
•	Besides the operator, no one is allowed to ride on machinery while traveling on public roads.			
•	All employees must wear Canadian Standards Association (CSA) approved safety footwear and proper clothing for the job being performed. 💠			
•	CSA approved safety glasses and hearing protection must be worn, when required.			
•	A designated area is assigned to each employee to park their vehicle.			
G	eneral			
•	No visitors are allowed in the fields beyond the designated parking area.			
•	No children under 14 should be allowed in the field or in trucks.			
•	"Employees Only" signs should be posted in storage areas and fields being worked.			
•	Employees should inform family members and friends of the workplace policy regarding visitors.
