#### **Students**

- Ask your host about safety precautions before you go to the workplace.
- O Ask if you need any personal protective equipment (PPE).
- O Follow all company safety rules.
- Ask your host how they stay safe daily.
- O Ask questions.
- O Talk about your experience at Take Our Kids to Work™ day with friends and family.

# **Parents/Guardians**

- O Talk to your children about workplace safety before Take Our Kids to Work™ day. Ensure they know the possible hazards.
- O Demonstrate safety practices while on the job.
- O Supervise students closely during the day. Address unsafe behaviours immediately.
- O Ask students if they have any safety concerns.
- O Be a safety leader! Keep workplace health and safety an ongoing conversation at home.
